SUMMARY

Two Minor Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Amendments have been recommended for Policy Board action by the Technical Advisory Committee per Section A(2) of the latest Memorandum of Understanding between the South Jersey Transportation Planning Organization, New Jersey Department of Transportation and New Jersey Transit Corporation.

PROPOSAL

The following TIP Amendments are being recommended for Policy Board approval as follows:

PROJECT

DB# S1410 – Eleventh Avenue (CR 669), Municipal Border to Route 50 (Broad Street), Mill & Overlay Resurfacing; Atlantic County is requesting that this project be deleted from the FY 2016-2025 TIP/STIP. The project was funded for construction in FY 2017 for \$1,700,000.

DB# S1603 – Washington Avenue (CR 608), Route 9 (New Road) to Fire Road (CR 651), Mill & Overlay Resurfacing; Atlantic County is requesting that this project be added to the FY 2016-2025 TIP/STIP in FY 2017 for \$1,700,000 of Construction funding.

BACKGROUND

Atlantic County is replacing the Eleventh Avenue project with the Washington Avenue project because the Washington Avenue project is in greater need of repair.

The switching of these two projects will not have a negative impact on the air quality in the region.

Fiscal constraint will be maintained as the funding for the new project is the same amount as the funding for the old project.
