SUMMARY

A Minor Amendment to the FY 2016-2025 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) has been recommended for Policy Board action by the Technical Advisory Committee per Section A(2) of the latest Memorandum of Understanding between the South Jersey Transportation Planning Organization, New Jersey Department of Transportation and New Jersey Transit Corporation.

PROPOSAL

The following Minor Amendment is being recommended for Policy Board approval as follows:

PROJECT

DB# X242: Crash Reduction Program

The amendment adds federal funding in the amount of \$5.00M in federal fiscal year 2017 to the existing statewide project.

BACKGROUND

The New Jersey Department of Transportation is recommending that \$5.0 million of Federal NHPP funds be added to this line item in federal fiscal year 2017 of the current Statewide TIP. The Crash Reduction Program is a comprehensive program of safety improvements designed to improve conditions and locations identified by the Highway Safety Improvement Program. These treatments may include pavement improvements, protection or removal of fixed objects, and utility pole relocation or replacement.

The additional federal funds to be added to this line item in the current TIP will not have a negative impact on the air quality in the region.

This project is being funded with Federal Resources from Prior Year Unobligated Balances thus maintaining fiscal constraint.
